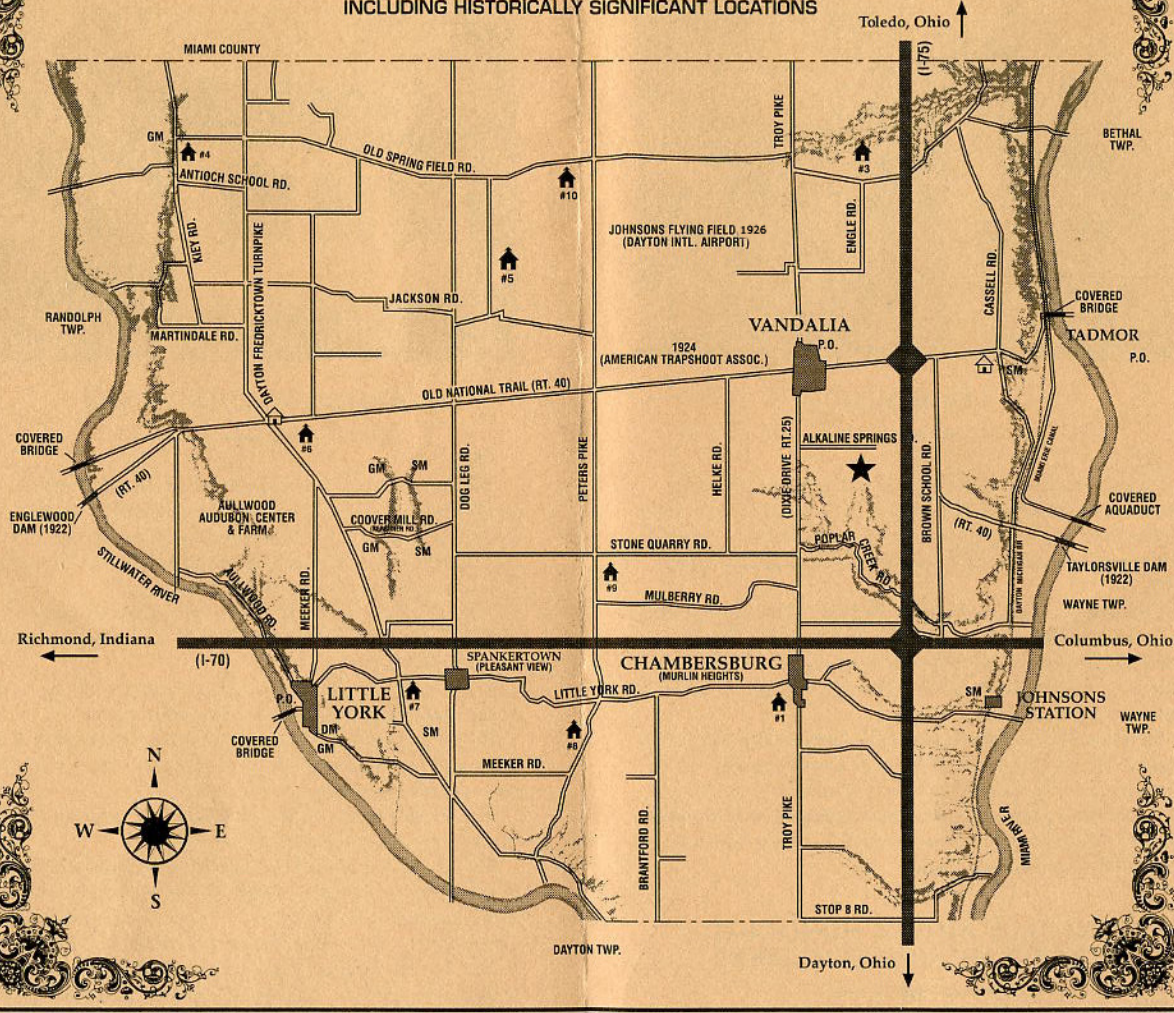

VANDALIA - Founded in 1838, (known as the Crossroads of America)

LITTLE YORK - Settled in 1787 (10 years before Dayton), 1st Post Office in Butler Twp.

SPANKERTOWN - Founded in 1878, Home of the Spanker Wagon and 177 year old St. Pauls Luthern Church

CHAMBERSBURG - Changed name to Murlin Heights in honor of traction car driver, Mr. Murlin.

JOHNSONS STATION - R.R. car turn around / junction.

TADMOR - 1839, Was destroyed in 1913 flood. Major Intra-State junction, (R.R., Canal, Old Natl. Trail & Miami River)
