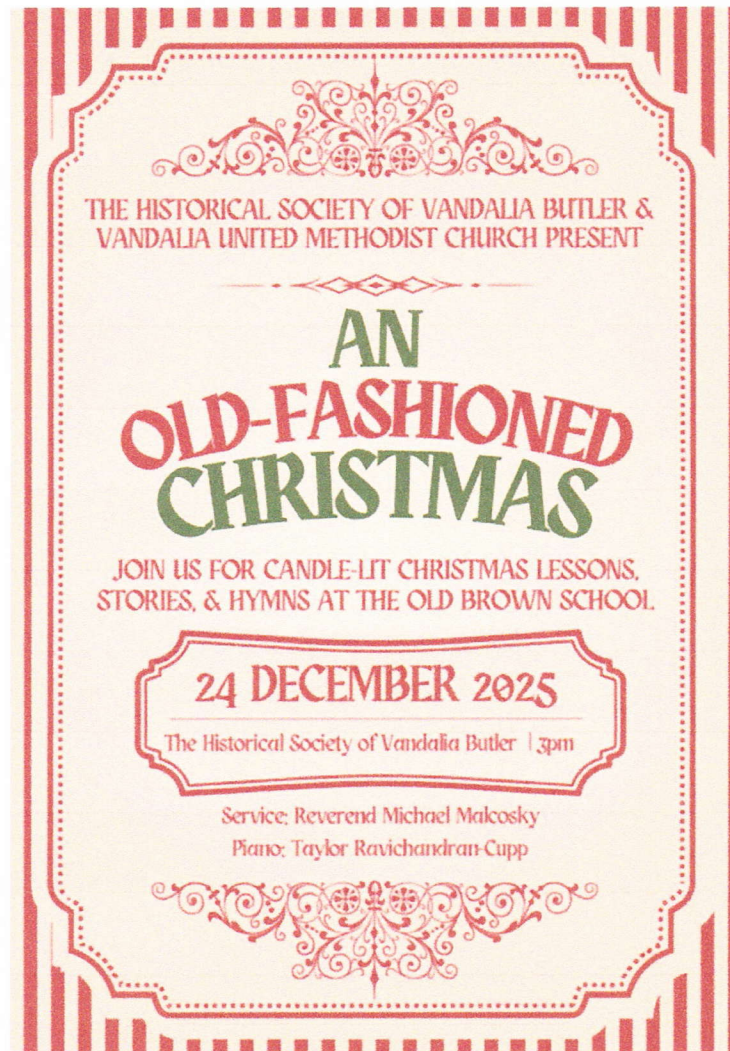

Civil War Grave Markings:

We have been invited by the Elizabeth Township Historical Society to the grave marking ceremony in honor of four Civil War soldiers at Casstown Cemetery, 1000 N. Children's Home Road, Casstown, OH, on Sunday, November 2, 2025. The program will commence at 2:00 p.m.

Four Civil War Veterans lay in unmarked graves at Casstown Cemetery, and the Elizabeth Township Historical Society applied for and received new Veteran headstones from the Veterans Administration. This was part of the Casstown War Veterans Monument Project completed by their society this past summer, which included the repair and/or cleaning of 135 Veteran headstones.

Corporal Samuel Watson Helvie, Private Thomas Richard Livingston, Private George W. Howett and Private Josiah Routzahn will be honored on November 2nd with all the pageantry deserved by soldiers who defended the Union. The ceremony will be conducted featuring a riderless horse, members of the Sons of the Union Soldiers of the Civil War and Elizabeth Township Historical



Esther Elizabeth Brown

April 10, 1933 – September 25, 2025

Esther Elizabeth Brown (Smith), age 92 of Vandalia, passed away Thursday, September 25, 2025. Esther was born in Boston, Massachusetts on April 10, 1933. She graduated from Lexington Sr. High School (MA) Class of 1950 and Fisher Jr. College, Boston, MA, completing a 2-year stenographic course. She married Foster F. Brown ("Bud") on Sept. 12, 1953. They spent 4 years at Lowery AFB, in Denver, Colorado, and after Foster's USAF discharge, they moved to Vandalia, Ohio. Esther loved her family and she was an excellent homemaker. She loved sewing, cooking, flower gardening, birdwatching, playing bridge, raising dogs, and OHIO STATE Football. She and Bud were active volunteers with the Vandalia Lions Club and raised 15 puppies in a 20-year span for the Canine Companions charity. She was a member of Shiloh Church U.C.C. She loved to cook and enjoyed hosting holiday gatherings, using her mother's fine Wedgwood China. She was the business office director at the Association of Theological Schools (ATS) for many years in Vandalia, OH and Pittsburgh, PA. She loved flower gardening and was the V-B Federation Gardener of the Year in 1972. Preceded in death by her husband of 69 years, Foster, in 2023.

Survived by 3 children, Steven (Sheri), Glenn (Debra) and Karen Thompson (Dave); 11 grandchildren, Alicia (Justin), Suzanne, Theresa, Melissa (Josh), Mitchell (Rachel), Bobby, Brian, Nate (Amber), Nick (Julia), Jesse & Corey; 10 great-grandchildren, Dylan, Carmen, Sonya, Hazel, Hannah, Nik, Azlyn, Liam, Pierce, & Billie J; 1 great-great grandchild, Azula; many other relatives and friends



Laundry Paddles

Our collection of household utensils includes two pieces labeled "Laundry Paddles, 18th Century, donated by friends from Lichtenfels, West Germany." These wooden tools, called paddles were used in the laundry process. Water was drawn from the well or spring or other water source and then was heated. Paddles were used to push the clothes into the hot water to loosen the dirt. Soap was rubbed on the wet clothes and they were returned to the water where the paddles were used again to help agitate the clothes while they soaked. Soapy clothes were wrung by hand or put through a mechanical wringer. Then paddles were used in the rinse process. The fork shaped paddle was used to remove clothes from the heated water. Clothes were hung to dry. Paddles continued to be used by some households when modern electric wringer washers became available. The paddles were used to get clothes out of the washing machine tub so they could be placed through the wringer. We have a wringer washing machine on display in the Wash House.

Events to Close out 2025 and Looking Ahead to 2026

Our open houses have ended for 2025. Many thanks to the volunteers that served as docents in our buildings. We still have two events remaining for the 2025. Check out the flyers in this newsletter for the Christmas Sale on November 6 and 7 and our Christmas Eve Program. Our wooden carolers will be on the Log House porch in late November and will remain there through December. Our buildings and grounds are a beautiful setting for holiday and winter pictures. We are working on closing our buildings for the winter and planning events for 2026. On April 18, 2026 we will participate in the Bee City celebration that is being planned by Vandalia Parks and Recreation. In June, we will have special events to honor our country's Semiquincentennial. Our open houses will explain how many of our streets and parks were named, how many kitchen tools were used, and how herbs were used in cooking and as medicine. Open houses are from 1-3 the first and third Sundays of each month, from April through October. There will be no open house on Easter Sunday.

Wright State University has a class in Community Based Learning as part of their Organized Leadership Program. Students taking this class volunteer with a non-profit for the semester. Vandalia resident, Addison Williams chose the Historical Society for her volunteer experience. We have enjoyed working with her and hearing her ideas.
