Clubs provided companionship, service, and increased educational opportunity for those involved. An integral part of Butler's environment, organizations were as multi-faceted as the people comprising them.



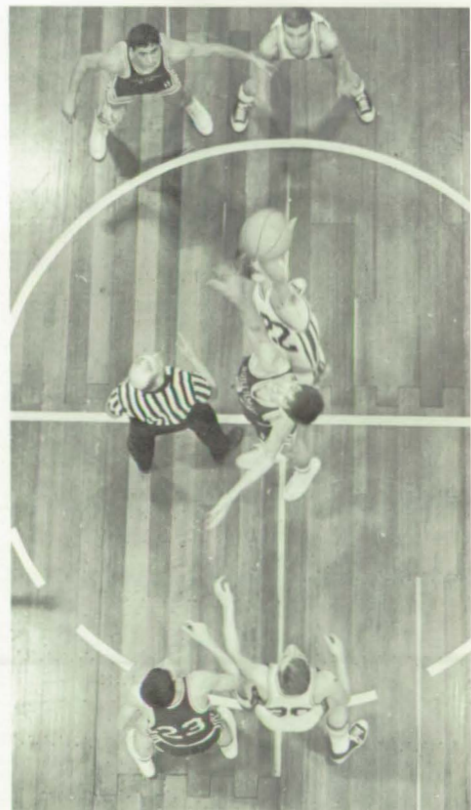
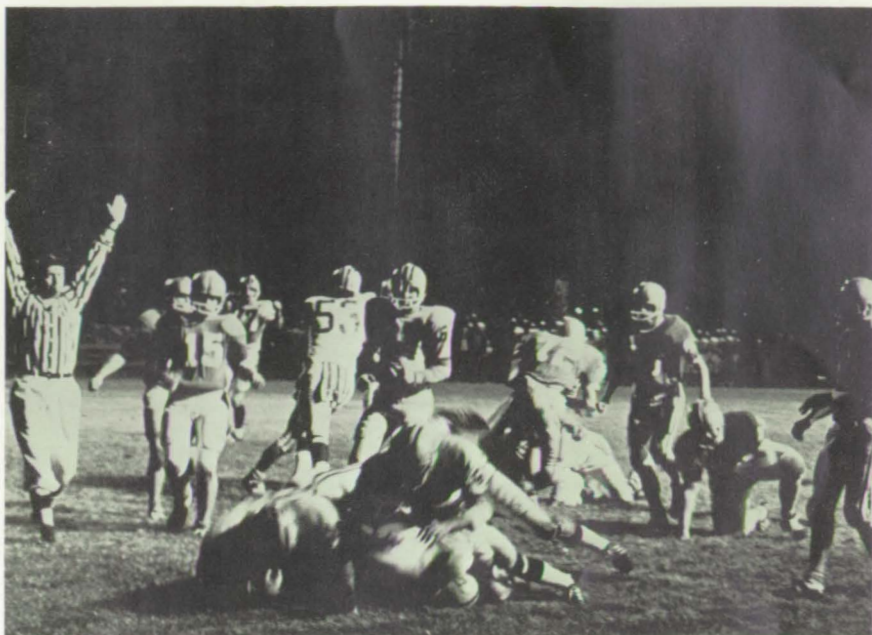
# Butler Sees Successful Sports Year

The Drama Department performed Antigone in November, and in May, West Side Story, one of the most ambitious undertakings in the history of the Butler Stage.



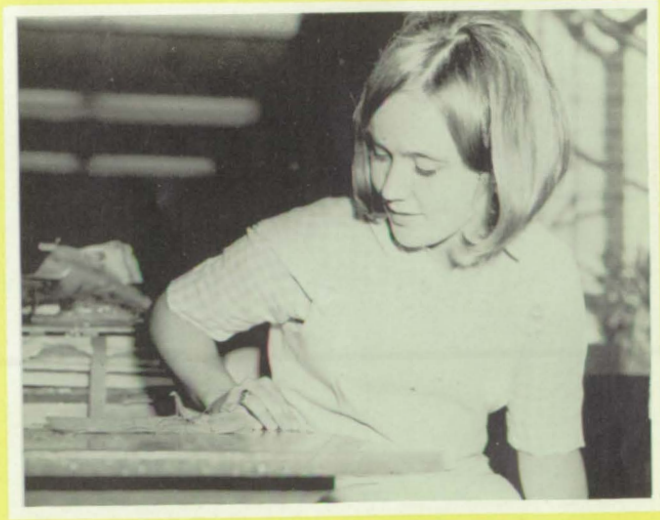

Although the business of getting an education is a serious one, students, teachers, and all concerned managed to enjoy themselves at the same time.

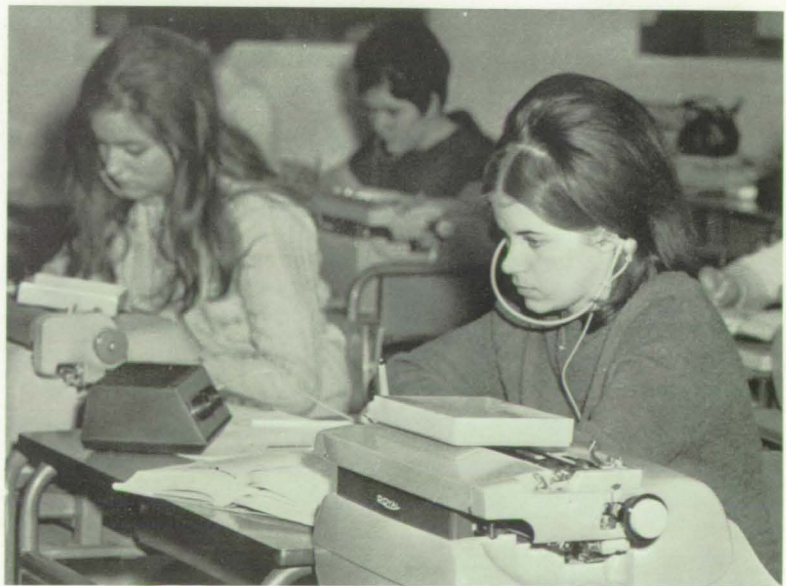


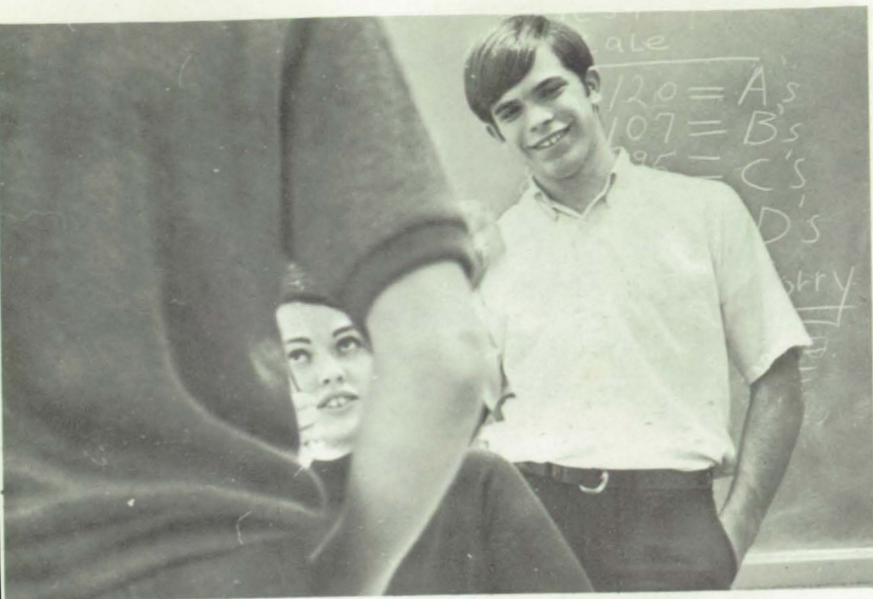

Their record was six and one. Sportsmanship as well as competition was strongly supported by all club members.

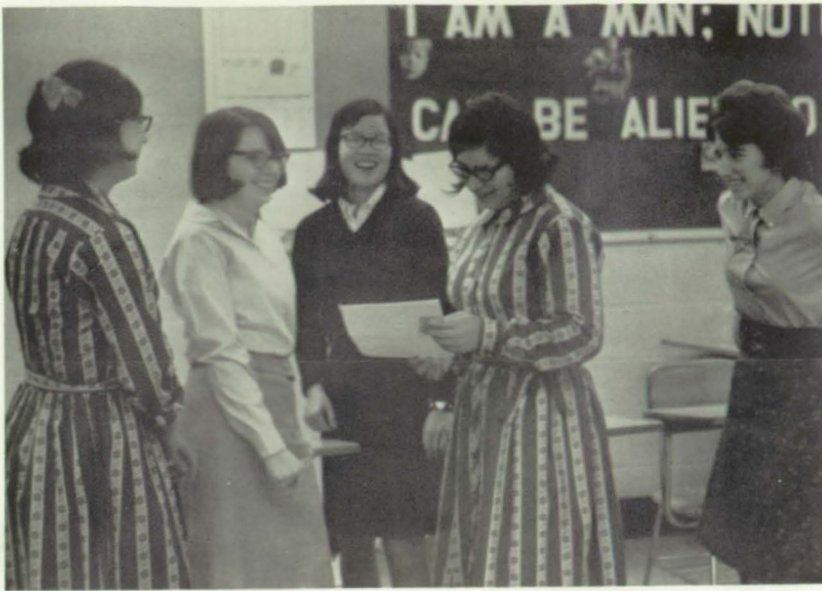

Always a pleasure to watch, the Aviators outscored their opponents 274 to 101. Thus, the Aviators were again a well-drilled and well-coached team.



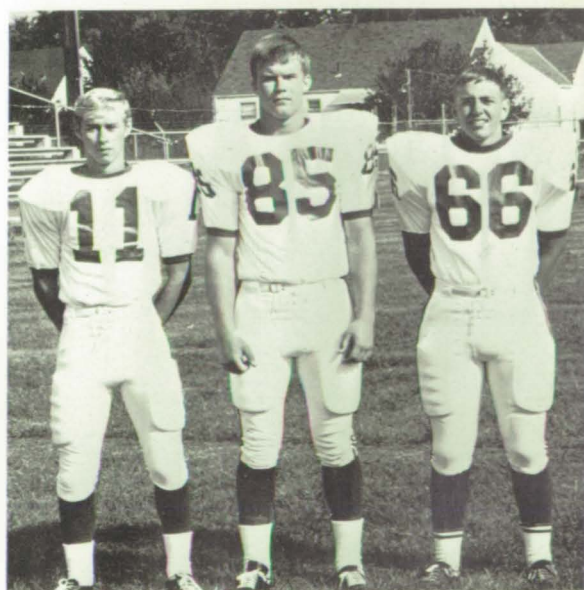

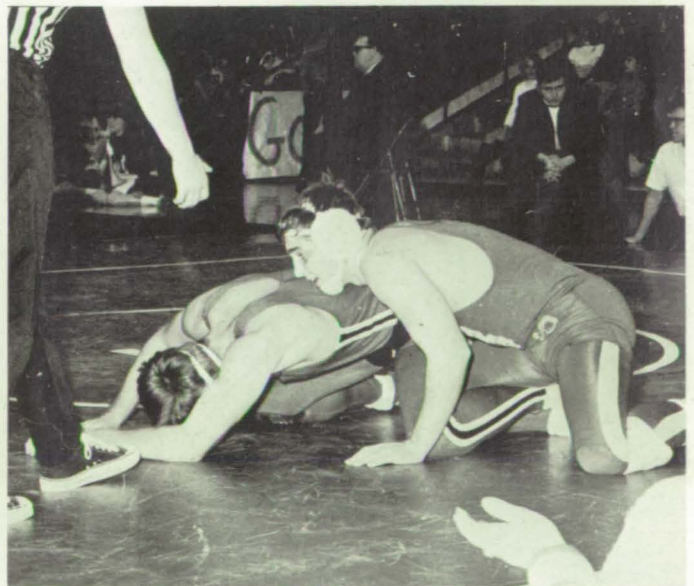
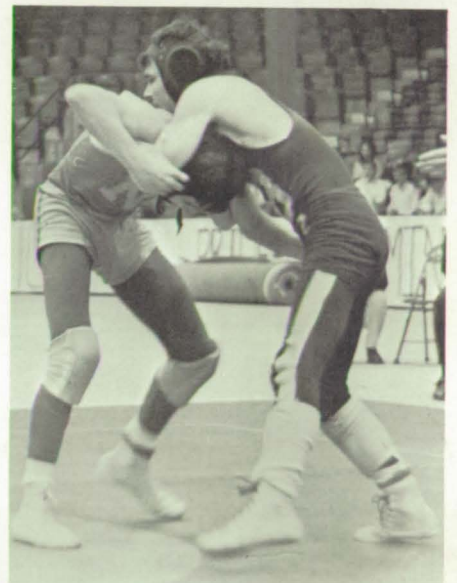


The Butler Wrestling Team finished its fifth year of wrestling by finishing 2nd at Wayne, 3rd at Northmont, and 4th in the SWBL.
